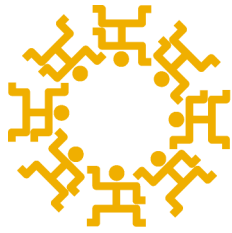
Ohana Foundation Donates Educational DVD Collection to Cupertino's Kids To Support Science & Social Studies Instruction in Santa Clara County
